
## CWCS KNIGHT'S SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The below chart indicates the projected income by category for 2022-2023.


2022-2023 Projected Income


While we might all think of different factors that led us to pursue Christian education, I firmly believe there are things that we should all hold as significant reasons for why you are a part of CWCS. First, and most importantly, as a school we strive to provide a worldview that is completely different than what the world provides our students. We strive to focus on God and His eternal purposes for our lives which helps shape the curriculum we teach, the conversations we have with students and how we are able to model Christ-like character traits to our students.

Modeling Christ-like traits to our students is best accomplished through exceptional partnerships between the school and our families. As a non-denominational school we know there are things we differ on, but when we approach our students and each other in a way that promotes conversation, understanding and a spirit that magnifies Christ's love for us there is absolutely nothing we cannot accomplish. Relationships are hard, but they are the basic foundation of what Christ has asked of us.

Jesus, in Matthew chapter 22 told the disciples that the greatest commandment is to 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself' (v 36-40). We can't love God without developing a relationship with him and likewise we cannot love our neighbors, or our brothers and sisters in Christ without developing relationships with each other.

This love that CWCS has for our students and our families helps us approach everyone from a whole person concept. When our students struggle, we struggle, and when they are successful we take joy in their success. The whole student approach allows us to incorporate a student's physical, mental, spiritual and emotional well-being into our day. As a Christian school, this gives us the opportunity to point directly to Christ in our academics and our pursuit of each student's personal development.

CWCS is thankful for our families who have committed to join us in training our students to understand biblical truths and to help prepare the hearts, hands and minds of our students in becoming wholehearted Christian servants.
